CONFERENCE SITE

IMPORTANT NOTE: If assigned to this two-day workshop, plan to report no later than 7:45 AM each day.

This is a two-day credentialing course supported by the Society of Critical Care Medicine. The Fundamental Critical Care Support Course (FCCS) is designed for both instructors and providers. FCCS is a standardized course, providing an approach to initial management (first 24 hours) of the critically ill patient for the non-intensivist. The course offers both classroom and "hands on" interactive instruction, especially care related to mechanical ventilation, hemodynamic monitoring, organ hypoperfusion and neurological support.

Specific topics include airway management, cardiopulmonary/cerebral resuscitation; acute respiratory failure; mechanical ventilation; basic hemodynamic monitoring; and diagnosis and management of shock. Additional content includes neurologic support; trauma and burn management; acute coronary syndromes; life-threatening infections; and electrolyte and metabolic disturbances.
